This could involve, but is not limited to:

- Software and technology
- R&D

Entrants will be measured against their ability to:

- Demonstrate best practice compliance/conformance to industry and/or professional codes/standards/recommended practices
- Clearly detail the innovation with a brief explanation
- Demonstrate what impacts the innovation has had to the success of the individual or organisation
- Demonstrate a strong commitment to innovation excellence
- Be recognised by their peers, employers and/or employees for their commitment to innovation
- Demonstrate ethical responsibility
- Supply at least one and no more than two reference letters from independent sources

Individual/ Organisation

Regional & Community Development

This award recognises an individual who/organisation that demonstrates excellence within their community that promotes charitable outcomes.

- Supply at least one and no more than two reference letters from independent sources

Individual

Trainee

This award recognises an individual who demonstrates excellence in their commitment to their own skill development and training within the Tasmanian timber industry.

The award nominee must be employed in the timber industry at the time of nomination and have their nomination supported by the General Manager/Managing Director/CEO, Company Principal or Training Manager/RTO.

The trainee will be measured against their ability to:

- Demonstrate best practice compliance/conformance to industry and/or professional codes/standards/recommended practices
- Demonstrate commitment to self-development and skill achievement through industry training
- Have completed a minimum national standard qualification within the year as recognised by the industry
- Be recognised by their peers, employers and/or employees for their commitment to environmental excellence
- Demonstrate ethical responsibility
- Supply at least one and no more than two reference letters from independent sources

Individual

Tree Farmer of the Year

This award recognises an individual who demonstrates excellence across a range of skills beyond best practice guidelines in tree farming.

- Entrants will have demonstrated excellence in three or more of the following:
 Excellence in farm planning, specifically the integration of forestry or trees
- as part of sustainable land management Innovation in any sector of private forestry – native forests, plantations,
- agroforestry etc
- Wide application of farm forestry principles
- Leadership in the community as a private forestry practitioner
- Achieving significant outcomes as a tree grower
- Supply at least one and no more than two reference letters from independent sources
